Martin KREUTNER

Dean, International Anti-Corruption Academy (IACA) Executive Secretary of the Assembly of Parties of IACA

Mr. Martin Kreutner is Dean of the International Anti-Corruption Academy (IACA) – an intergovernmental organization with Member States from all regions of the globe – as well as Executive Secretary of its Assembly of Parties.

Born in Austria in 1964, he holds a Master's degree in law from the University of Innsbruck (AUT), and in 2004 obtained an additional Master's grade in Policing and Public Order Studies from the University of Leicester (UK). He was a commissioned officer in the armed forces with various troop, staff, and ministerial assignments, including a total of five years with different international (UN peacekeeping as well as humanitarian) field missions. In 2001, he transferred to the Austrian Federal Ministry of the Interior and was commissioned to build up the Austrian police oversight body, which later became the national anti-corruption authority; from 2001 to 2010 he was the Director of this entity/entities, the Austrian Federal Bureau for Internal Affairs. From 2010 to the beginning of 2011, he acted as the Special Advisor for anti-corruption affairs to the Austrian Minister of the Interior. Mr. Kreutner frequently (guest-)lectures on (anti-)corruption, compliance, the Rule of Law, international (humanitarian) law, as well as security topics at numerous universities, academies, organizations, and conferences all over the globe.

Prior to his formal appointment as Dean of IACA and Executive Secretary of its Assembly of Parties in 2012, Mr. Kreutner was Executive Secretary of IACA's Provisional Assembly and its Provisional Commission (2011–2012), elected Chairman of IACA's International Steering Committee (2008–2011), and Chairman of the IACA International Transition Team (2010–2012). He is/was member of, *inter alia*, the International Advisory Board of the Malaysia Anti-Corruption Academy (MACA), the Advisory Board of Transparency International – Chapter Austria, the Executive Committee of the International Association of Anti-Corruption Authorities (IAACA), the OMV Resourcefulness Advisory Board, the Legal Symposium Advisory Committee of the European Forum Alpbach, and Interpol's International Group of Experts on Corruption (IGEC) (2005–2012). Among his other functions, Mr. Kreutner is co-editor of the *Compliance Praxis* magazine and served as (elected) President of the *European Partners Against Corruption* network (EPAC) (2004–2012) and the EU's anti-corruption contact point network (EACN) (2009–2012), Chairman of the Austrian Supreme Disciplinary Tribunal (MoI) (2004–2012), a member of the Austrian Federal Appeals Tribunal (2005–2013), (alternate and) Head of Delegation to all Conference(s) of the States Parties to the UNCAC, alternate Head of the Austrian Delegation to GRECO (2007–2011), as well as Vice-President and member of the Executive Committee of the European Healthcare Fraud and Corruption Network (EHFCN) (2006–2008).

He is/was a senior anti-corruption evaluator, peer reviewer, and consultant for, *inter alia*, the UN, the Council of Europe, the OSCE, Transparency International, and the World Bank. In addition, Mr. Kreutner is/was a certified court expert on, *inter alia*, general criminology (1999–2015), author of many articles and papers on (anti-)corruption, compliance, and security issues, editor of books on corruption (2006, 2008, 2010), and co-author of a legal commentary (2005, 2009).

Both in 2014 and 2015, Mr. Kreutner was recognized by *Ethisphere* (USA) as one of *100 Most Influential People in Business Ethics* for his efforts to combat corruption with IACA, as well as his efforts to improve human welfare worldwide through his work with the United Nations, Transparency International, and other global organizations.
