## Martin KREUTNER

### **Dean, International Anti-Corruption Academy (IACA) Executive Secretary of the Assembly of Parties of IACA**

Mr. Martin Kreutner is Dean of the International Anti-Corruption Academy (IACA) - an intergovernmental organization with Member States from all regions of the globe - as well as Executive Secretary of its Assembly of Parties.

Born in Austria in 1964, he holds a Master's degree in law from the University of Innsbruck (AUT), and a Master's degree in Policing and Public Order Studies from the University of Leicester (UK). He was a commissioned officer in the armed forces including a total of five years with different international field missions. In 2001, he was commissioned to build up the Austrian national anti-corruption authority, which he headed from 2001 to 2010.

Prior to his appointment as Dean of IACA and Executive Secretary of its Assembly of Parties in 2012, Mr. Kreutner was Executive Secretary of IACA's Provisional Assembly and its Provisional Commission (2011-2012), elected Chairman of IACA's International Steering Committee (2008-2011), and Chairman of the IACA International Transition Team (2010-2012).

He is member of, *inter alia*, the EU's International Anti-Corruption Advisory Board (EUACI IACAB) vis-à-vis the Ukraine Parliament, the Advisory Board of Transparency International - Chapter Austria, the OMV Resourcefulness Advisory Board, the Legal Symposium Advisory Committee of the *European Forum Alpbach*, and the International Advisory Board of the Malaysia Anti-Corruption Academy (MACA). Among his other functions, Mr. Kreutner is co-editor of the *Compliance Praxis* magazine, is/was a senior anti-corruption evaluator/peer reviewer/advisor for, *inter alia*, the United Nations, the Council of Europe, the European Union, the Organisation for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE), Transparency International, the World Bank, and the Austrian Minister of the Interior.

Mr. Kreutner frequently (guest-)lectures on (anti-)corruption, compliance, the Rule of Law, and international (humanitarian) law at numerous universities, academies, organizations, and conferences all over the globe, and is author of many articles, papers, and other publications on (anti-)corruption, compliance, and security issues.

Both in 2014 and 2015, Mr. Kreutner was recognized by *Ethisphere* (USA) as one of *100 Most Influential People in Business Ethics* for his efforts to combat corruption with IACA, as well as his efforts to improve human welfare worldwide through his work with the United Nations, Transparency International, and other global organizations.
