Hermann Feiner, Director-General

Hermann Feiner was born on 26 December 1956. In February 1975, he joined the Austrian Federal Police in Vienna. From March 2000 to October 2001, he was a member of the cabinet of the Austrian Federal Minister of the Interior. In this position he was responsible for the Austrian Federal Police, police training and international relations. For over 10 years, he was the President of the European Police Union (EPU). He studied at the Austrian Academy for Public Administration and attended the 5th European Senior Police Officers Course of the Association of European Police Colleges (AEPC) in Warnsveld, the Netherlands. In August 2010, Hermann Feiner participated in the Harvard Kennedy School of Government's programme "National and International Security".

On 8 February 2010, he was appointed as Director-General of the Directorate-General IV (Services and Supervision) of the Austrian Federal Ministry of the Interior. The Federal Bureau of Anti-Corruption (.BAK), the Department for Internal Audit, the Audit Centre for EU Funds, the Department for Procurement, as well as the Department for Memorials and War Crimes are under the direct supervision of the Director-General IV. Furthermore, the Director of the Directorate for Communications and Information Technology (two departments) and the Director of the Directorate for Management, Buildings and Technology (three departments) are directly responsible to the Director-General IV.
